

KING'S - LYNN -The Maids Head

- The Maids Head - a bustling and busy pub in the heart of old town, is a popular live music venue. Known from 1965 as 'Ye Olde Maydens Heade' it has been rechristened by present landlord Peter Lewland as 'The Maids Head'. Research shows the pub has been faithfully returned to it's original name 'The Maids Head' circa 1748 as recorded by then landlord in occupation Thomas Webster. While the building is 18th century, the name dates back to the 1500's and may be in honour of Queen Elizabeth I.

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

- The Conservancy Board and Port & Pilotage Authority -

was founded as a result of the damage to the 'Wick Bay' which ran aground in 1889. Efforts to refloat her broke her back, and the corporation of King's Lynn was held responsible for clearing the wreck. The Board was established by the King's Lynn Conservancy Act of 1897 to safeguard the river and oversee the safe marking of the channel, acting also as the Pilotage Authority.



- Denver Windmill - is one of
Norfolk most iconic windmills, and

community. During WWII the mill also

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- Red Mount Chapel - is a three storey octagonal structure on a hillock in 'The Walks' public park, built in 1485 during the reign of Richard III. Being a wayside chapel for English and European Christian pilgrims disembarking at Kings Lynn, on their way to England's second most holy shrine after Canterbury - the Shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham.

Four miracles happened here - the Mount survived the Reformation, the Civil War, German bombing in 1942, and received a Heritage Lottery grant to restore the Chapel and the Walks.

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
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- Freddies.....the Deli on the Corner -

'The Priory' - is the oldest residential building in Downham Market, with some parts dating back to the 13th century. Latterly the Priory has been a solicitors office, before becoming hearth and home to Birgit, Barry, Oliver-James and Amelie-Jade...and of course - man's best friend - Prince!

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- The Legacy Dukes Head Hotel -

a 4 star hotel overlooking King's Lynn's Tuesday Market Place - has been a grade ll listed building since December 1951. Built in 1683 for member of parliament John Turner by architect and builder Henry Bell, who also designed and built the local Customs House. The Legacy Dukes Head Hotel, standing on the site of an ancient inn called 'The Gryffin' offers great food and hospitality alongside modern technology and free Wi Fi. 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
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- The Customs House - was built as a merchant exchange in 1683 by architect Henry Bell, who had been recruited by the town's mayor - Sir John Turner.

Bell also built the Dukes Head Hotel in Tuesday Market Place. While the seaborne trading port had been dominated by the European Hanseatic League in medieval times, by the 17th century homegrown merchants were flourishing on wine, corn, coal, timber and fishing. An international trading port - King's Lynn was second only to London in size.



- St Edmund's Church - and Downham Market were from early times associated with the Benedictine Abbey of Ramsey. It is commonly held that there was a smaller Benedictine house in Downham's Priory Rd. Owing to the close connection between Downham and the Abbey, it seemed reasonable that Ramsey's devotion to the brave local St Edmund should be reflected in the parish of Downham's church dedication. The Feast of Saint Edmund, traditionally held on St Edmund's Day - 20th November, will be held on Sunday 16th this year.

- Downham Market's Signal Box -

is one of England's twenty six rarest and best preserved grade II-listed signal boxes, some of which have their origins in the Victorian era! Downham's own box dates back to 1883 and is built of wood blocks cut to resemble stone. In an effort to preserve the traditions of trains and railways - particularly the 'golden age of steam' - Network Rail has joined forces with English Heritage to seek out the best examples of the 500 hundred or so remaining signal boxes in use.

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


- The Fluffy Biskit Narrowboat -
